Submissions

Q: What kind of articles are you looking for?

A: We are accepting all kinds of articles, ranging from literature reviews to research papers to informative essays. Currently, we are not strict about the genre of the piece of writing that you may submit. If you have any questions about this, please do not hesitate to contact journal.psych@gmail.com.

Q: Is there a word limit to the articles that may be submitted?

A: No, however, if your article is more than 15 pages long, we may have to condense parts of it.

Q: Is there a particular format that must be followed?

A: We ask that you use APA as your citation guide. If you have other components in addition to the essay, please submit those as well.

Q: What kinds of articles are eligible?

A: Any writing you have done for a psychology course is eligible to be published. This means that you may submit articles that you have written in previous years.

Q: What are the criteria for the editorial board?

A: These are the guidelines, but those who are interested are welcome to apply –

- Dedicated individuals who are keen on learning the topics of psychology and the process of publishing
- Students who have editorial experience
- Preference given to –
 - Psychology students
 - 3rd and 4th years (if you are a 2nd year student that has extensive editorial experience, an exception can be made)
 - *Note:* These are preferences, NOT requisites, so please do not hesitate to apply.
- Other important roles you could take on include layout and advertisement/promotions

Q: What is the level of commitment?

A: As a member of the editorial board, you would be required to attend (likely) 1 meeting per month, participate in Google polls, edit 1-2 articles, and correspond via email. If you require a tentative schedule, please email journal.psych@gmail.com.
